This year, Photo Kathmandu is working with a curatorial framework that puts a spotlight on gender, power, identity, patriarchy, and sexuality. Photo Kathmandu is sensitive to the subtle and not so subtle ways in which the intersection of these structures affect not only the world we inhabit but also the ways in which we engage with it, and encourages conversations and explorations around these very present themes.

Set in this state of limbo, this work explores the concepts of identity and gender and seeks to restore to each of these men and women the face their country stole from them.





After fundraising for Lam Pati in Chyasal in 2015, and the Bungamati Museum in 2016, Photo Kathmandu continues its efforts towards supporting its host communities. This special Bhoé (Newari Feast) is a fundraising effort for the After School Program run by the Society for Urban Poor (SOUP).


